

OIPA GENERAL MEETING REPORT



Summarized Minutes of the General Meeting

on November 13, 2017 — Bart Goldberg, Secretary

Attendance:

Once again, the attendance was good, with about 30 of us there. Most of us were again eating the cookies from Fannie's Bakery. I can get used to this. There were a couple of new attendees to welcome at this meeting: **Beata Sieczka**, who resides in the 3300 block of Kildare and **Jennifer O'Brie**n from the 3900 block of Lowell. Thanks for coming and we hope you liked it. President Ankney commenced the meeting at 7:03 PM.

Committee Reports & Announcements:

President Ankney decided to largely skip over this part of the meeting to allow more time to our feature presentation (!) which was...

City Living 101:

My wife was excited that I was going to be attending this meeting as we both thought it would be quite useful. After all, excluding behavioral tendencies, I am now a lot closer to the age of 101 than I am to the age of one. I thought that I could learn some good strategies to deal with the urban problems that are particularly trying for the centenarian crowd. My wife hoped that I could learn how to take advantage of my age to get some really cool free stuff. As the panel was introduced, I realized that we were both to be disappointed. Instead, we were all going to learn solutions to the types of problems that are intrinsic to life in the big city. Fortunately, no one else appeared to have been confused.

The esteemed panel was composed of five local experts. They included two aldermanic aides: **Bryan Robbin** from the 39th Ward (Alderman Laurino's office) and **Tiffany Liner** from the 45th Ward (Alderman Arena's office): along with two police officers from the 17th District, those being **Sergeant Iza** and **Officer Askar**; and **Nel Rhodes** from the Independence Park Advisory Council. President Ankney took questions from the guests, and the following is a description of some of the discussion.

Abandoned cars and motorcycles: The advice was that if the vehicle has been parked in the same place for over two weeks you should call both your Alderman and 311. The 311 call will result in them coming out to mark the car, and then it can be towed if it is still there in another week.

Leaves: Raking (or blowing) your leaves into the street is not permitted. A person can be ticketed for this if caught by a ward superintendent. Leaves are to be put into brown bags, and then you should call the Alderman or 311 to arrange a special pickup. The streets are swept from April to mid-November generally. The above discussions segued into some complaints about where Streets and San leaves emptied garbage cans.

311 vs. 911: Officer Askar wanted to help us understand when a call to 911 is appropriate. The answer was essentially whenever a crime was in progress, or when there was a threat to life, physical injury or property damage in the commission of a crime. For example, 911 was appropriate if you are observing a drug deal in the alley right then. You should then call with as much information as you can provide. Somewhat surprisingly it would also be appropriate if you needed assistance in removing a homeless person from your property. In all other situations you call 311.



50-50 Sidewalk Program: This is a popular city program where they will pay for one half of the cost of replacing your sidewalks, but you really have to be on top of it to hope to take advantage, as It is essentially only available a few hours a year. You need to call your Alderman's office to find out the day that registration for the program is available. It is sometime in the month of January, and then you have to call early on that day since it fills up so quickly.

Trees: The trees in the parkways are removed by the City only if they are dead or dying. You can also call the Alderman's office to have parkway trees trimmed. There is presently about a 3 to 6 week backlog. You would also call them to replace dead trees. ComEd should be called if a tree is near a power line.

There were many more questions wanting to be asked,

but President Ankney took pity on the panel (and we thank each of them for attending) and the meeting then adjourned at about 8:10 p.m.

Next Meeting: The next time we will meet will be for the annual Holiday Dinner. It is on December 10, 2017 at 5 p.m. This should really be a treat because it will be at La Villa in the neighborhood-renowned La Strada Dining Room. It may not have made the Michelin Guide (what does a tire company know about good eating anyway), it has a lot more ambience than the basement at the Church. Because there is limited seating in the room we ask that you make a reservation with us. There will be great La Villa food, a cash bar, and unrestrained merriment. If you can, bring a toy for the kids, and we also are taking small donations to help cover the additional cost for having it there (such as gratuities for the staff). Ho, ho, ho!


