
Most importantly—get out there and vote early or on February 28. Our local elected officials play a critical role in day-to-day issues impacting our neighborhood.







Treasurer's Report - Lynn Ankney

The November 2022 account balance looks high but doesn't account for:

- a. 8 of 9 annual donations being delivered this week (Irving Park Garden Club in May 2023)
- b. The 2022 OIPA Holiday Party at La Villa.

The Board approved the Treasurer's Report.

a. Ward Business


- 39th Ward Business: Montrose traffic study request. OIPA sent an email Tues 11/29 and cc'd neighbors who requested help
- 45th Ward Business: OIPA sent a request to Northwestern Memorial Hospital for status update on Kilbourn traffic solutions and inquired about the residential lot at 4522 W. Irving Park Road. At time of meeting no responses were received.

b. Aldermanic Candidate Forums and/or questionnaires

 A candidate questionnaire has been started but not been finalized. In lieu of the questionnaire, the board decided to partner with other civic organizations and neighbors to organize forums in all three wards (45, 39, 30) within the OIP neighborhood boundaries.

c. Forums

- 39th The first forum was held on 01/19. A second forum date is still in the works. A sedond forum is possible. OIPA will provide details if a second forum occurs.
- 30th A neighbor reached out and said they were willing to coordinate. The Board agreed to accept and share materials developed in planning for the 39th ward forum. The forum date and venue have not yet been discussed.
- 45th Neighboring civic groups and OIPA have been in contact and are working on a date and a place for a forum.

The Board is exploring options for a plaque to commemorate Gurtrud Kolmar, the park's namesake.

e. Murals

Graffiti on the Kostner underpass "Dreams" mural has been painted over in blue to match the mural. After much discussion about the options and design the board is leaning towards replacing "Dreams" with a new mural. Finding a well known artist or changing the material to mosaic or tile, as well as including the underpass columns were discussed as ideas. The OIPA beautification committee will reach out to local organization The Green Star Movement to begin a conversation.

Treasurer's Report - Lynn Ankney

Lynn Ankney presented the December 2022 Treasurer's Report. The report showed greater than normal expenditures in December, but this was expected and was for great things like OIPA's annual charitable donations to area organizations accounting for a \$4,400 debit, and a \$2,473 debit for the OIPA Holiday Party on December 4th. The Treasurer's Report was approved by the board.

When to Call 311 vs. 911

Call 911 while the incident you are reporting is in progress and the on-site presence of a police officer is necessary to help resolve the matter (e.g., burglary in progress, incident involving injuries, quieting loud neighbors, etc.). You should contact 311 if the incident you are reporting has occurred and the offender is gone from the scene.

Use 311 to find information, request non-emergency services, or report non-emergency issues. You can call 311 to find out what Police District and beat you live in, as well as the date, time and location of your next beat meeting. Contacting 311 gives you easy access to non-emergency police services, from filing police reports to talking to police personnel in your district.

City of Chicago Emergency Heating Repair Program

Application will be accepted through April 1, 2023.

Program Overview


The Emergency Heating Repair Program (EHRP) provides qualified homeowners with a one-time grant to repair or replace their furnaces or boiler heating systems. The program is administered by the Department of Housing (DOH). Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. The grants are available to owner-occupants of one-to-four unit residential buildings. A site inspection will be performed by a DOH rehab construction specialist to determine the heating system's condition after a completed application is processed and approved.

How to Apply

Submit a service request through 311 or call the Department of Housing's (DOH) customer service line at 312.744.3653 to request an application. Follow the detailed information on completing the forms and submitting copies of all required documents, including proof of ownership, income, and identification.

RECIPES FROM THE BOARD & MEMBERS





Ingredients:

- 5 ounces 100% cherry juice (or pomegranate juice or cranberry juice)
- · 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- ·1 large lime, juiced
- Sparkling mineral water to top off each drink (I love Topo Chico)
- OPTIONAL: 2 shots (jiggers) vodka [one shot or one jigger equals 1.5 fluid ounces]

Garnish:

- 2 tablespoons maple sugar for sugar rim
- Fresh raspberries
- Heart Shaped Ice Cubes: 100% pomegranate juice for silicone heart molds (or cherry juice or cranberry juice)

Instructions:

- MAKE IN ADVANCE: Place a silicone heart mold on a small baking sheet. Fill the molds with pomegranate juice (or cherry juice or cranberry juice) and place the baking sheet in your freezer for eight hours until juice is frozen solid. I typically do this the night before.
- JUST BEFORE SERVING: Prepare 3-4 cocktail glasses with a sugar rim. Place maple sugar on a small plate. Rub the rim of the glasses with a lime wedge (just enough to wet the rim) and then dip the rim of each glass in the maple sugar. You can use any granulated sugar here but to keep it refined sugar-free I recommend using maple sugar. Set glasses aside or place in your freezer to chill the glasses.
- PREPARE THE DRINK: Shake cherry juice, maple syrup, lime juice and vodka (if using) in a cocktail shaker filled with ice cubes.
- Fill the cocktail glasses with ice cubes. Pour the shaken cocktail into the glasses (about halfway). Leave room for sparkling mineral water.
- Fill each glass with sparkling mineral water and stir gently with a spoon. Leave room for 1-2 red heart ice cubes.
- Remove red heart ice cubes from the silicone mold and place 1-2 (or more!) in each drink.
- Arrange fresh raspberries on a cocktail pick and place the pick in the drink or balancing on the glass rim.
- · Enjoy immediately.
