



OIPA BOARD MEETING REPORT



Summarized Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on September 5, 2023

Meeting scheduled for 7 p.m. via Zoom

Meeting started at 7:05 p.m.

Attendees

Adrienne Chan, Anne Swingen, Colleen Kenny, Dan William, Dave Ryan, Lynn Ankney, Meredith O'Sullivan, Merry Marwig, Michael Cannon, Nicholas Plagman-Frank, and Scott Legan

After sharing pleasantries while we waited for our OIPA board colleagues to sign into the meeting President Chan called the Board of Directors meeting to order for the last time during her term. At the September OIPA General meeting, association members will elect a new slate of officers to the Board. Because of term limits in the President's position, Adrienne will step down from her officer's role but will continue to serve as a director. Thank you, Adrienne, for your leadership over the past four years. Our neighborhood and OIPA are lucky to have you as an advocate.

Financial Report

The first order of business was a financial update from OIPA Treasurer Lynn Ankney. The month of August was a good one for receipts. The balance sheet recorded more than \$2,500 in advertising receipts as well as the start of membership renewals in August (This is not surprising since fall marks the beginning of our traditional membership renewal season). Other receipts in August came from the OIP Parents Committee, which relaunched with a Back-to-School event at Kolmar Park in August, and donations to Keep

OIP Clean, now under OIPA's financial management. Disbursements included all the normal expenses related to newsletters and costs related to the Backto-School event, website, and State of Illinois annual reporting. Adrienne brought approval of the August OIPA financial report to vote, Meredith seconded the motion, and unanimously approved by the remaining directors.

Membership

New Old Irving Park Association membership rates for 2023-2024 were published in the September newsletter and updated on the OIPA website on September 3. Increases in annual household fees were necessary partly due to the increasing costs of publishing our monthly newsletter and member perks and partly because of our organization's increased charitable donations over the past couple of years.

While membership rates are increasing slightly, the Board decided to leave advertising rates the same but to make a push to increase advertising revenue by pursuing new and existing businesses and asking them to become new advertisers. The Board discussed a few of the business directors they have approached already and is still planning on organizing a marketing committee special session in the coming months to continue the momentum.

In addition to membership rate and advertising strategies, the Board discussed member swag for 2024. In past years, we have always given away canvas tote bags to our All-Star and Good Neighbor members.

For the past few months, the Board has had a lot of discussions about changing it up next year. We have explored commissioning a custom print produced by a neighborhood artist. This month, the continued discussion focused on potential sizes for the print as well as a theme for the commissioned piece.

Newsletter

Topics for October's message from the Board were discussed and settled. The idea was also shared to highlight the new rolling renewal of OIPA memberships. Gone are the days of fall membership renewals for everyone and missing out on the perks of membership if you join early in the year. Watch the newsletter for this and other improvements made possible by our new database platform going live in September!

New Business

 Wildlight Yoga, one of our monthly newsletter advertisers (page 11), has completed a renovation and expansion of their studio. The Board discussed how to highlight their new space and extend a special invitation from Wildlight to OIPA members.

 Holiday Trolley - Six Corners Association is organizing the NW Chicago Holiday Trolley as they have done in past years. They are working to secure

funding for the event this holiday season. Dave Ryan attended a planning meeting and reported to the rest of the Board. After much



discussion, it was decided that OIPA will offer complementary advertising for this event but will continue to reserve monetary donations for events within our neighborhood boundaries and charitable organizations that work within our community.

- Liquor License Request by Convenient Food Mart 4301 W. Irving Park Road
 - The Board learned about this request during the meet and greet with Alderperson Cruz.
 - After learning about this, OIPA facilitated a survey to neighbors.
 - Responses to the survey were mostly opposed to issuing Convenient Food Mart a liquor license.
 - The Board discussed the results in detail and decided to issue a formal letter of opposition, including reasons for not supporting this request.
- Peoples Gas Site Redevelopment A public meeting has been scheduled for the developer to present updated plans to the community. It will

be held Wednesday, September 20, at 6 p.m. at the Copernicus Center, 5216 W Lawrence Ave.

Old Business

- OIPA directors attended a "Get to Know You" meeting with Alderperson Cruz. Highlights from the meeting included:
 - The Alderperson shared with the developer that she will not support the Dunkin Doughnuts Drivethrough Proposal at 4229 W. Irving Park Rd.
 - OIPA Directors shared with Alderperson Cruz that we are interested in seeing quality pedestrian focused mixed use development at the Peoples Gas site. This is not in the Alderperson's ward but borders it as it does Old Irving Park.
 - Alderperson Cruz has committed to continuing quarterly power washing of the OIP viaducts in her ward.
- Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy (CAPS)
 Meetings The Board decided to send information about upcoming CPD CAPS meetings in our e-blasts, and in the calendar in the OIPA newsletter
- Metropolitan Planning Commission (MPC) Irving Park Road Pedestrian Safety Improvement. MPC will work with state officials to secure funding that has been earmarked by the State of Illinois.
- Gas Station Proposal 4301 W. Montrose
 OIPA communicated its opposition to this proposal and will follow up with Alderperson Nugent's office to get an update about the fate of this proposal.
- Irving Park Historical Society Archives (IPHS) –
 The archives have been sorted and are ready to be presented to the Sulzer Library.

The Board decided that materials not accepted by the library would not be returned to OIPA. The Board will

defer to IPHS stakeholders to make the final decision about any materials not accepted by the library.

started the meeting by introducing
the OIPA Board Directors present:
Dave Ryan, Dan William, Meredith

O'Sullivan, and Michael Cannon. She then introduced the current BOD Officers, Lynn Ankney, Scott Legan, Nicholas Plagman-Frank, and herself. The first general meeting after the summer break is when OIPA membership elects the Board of Directors. On odd-numbered years, members elect officer positions to the board. As her last act as President, Adrienne invited the OIPA BOD officers seeking a new 2-year term to the front of the room. The 2023 slate of officers included the following people, followed by the position they are seeking.

Before releasing neighbors to continue socializing, Adrienne shared an announcement about a Peoples Gas site redevelopment meeting hosted by the developer and Alderperson Gardner's office scheduled for Wednesday, September 20, at 6:30 p.m. at the Copernicus Center.

She also asked OIPA members what speakers and topics they would like to see at future OIPA General Meetings. One idea shared was electrifying your home with solar energy. This question from Adrienne invited additional questions from members. Questions included:

 When will traffic lights be installed at Kilbourn and Irving Park Road on the west side of the Northwestern Medicine development, and when

will the new specialty medical offices open?

- Have any retailers been announced for the new retail spaces at Clarendale Six Corners?
- Can OIPA membership get consensus on the kinds of retailers and restaurants that open in our neighborhood? (In reference to the recent Dunkin Doughnuts drive-through proposal for the previous Golden Nugget Restaurant site.)
- Has there been any other development interest in the vacant Golden Nugget building?
- When will the participatory budgeting project for bike lanes/striping on Montrose begin? (This is a 2024 budget item; OIPA will follow up with 39th Ward.)

- Is anything known about Mayor Johnson's plan to house migrants in large tents around the city?
- Will the city come to OIPA or the Alderperson's office with any plans to locate migrants in our ward?
- Are any changes coming to the Six Corners Jewel with the Albertson's and Kroger merger?
- Can Old Irving Park get a chamber of commerce to support current businesses and drive recruitment of business neighbors?

Adrienne Chan adjourned the semi-formal portion of the meeting at 7:48 p.m. and invited members to stay for drinks, snacks, and socializing.





IRVING PARK GARDEN CLUB





ontainer gardening is critical for Irving Park Garden Club members living in condos or apartments without yards to use. To get their gardening fix, they fill their porches, decks, and balconies with planters to grow their favorite flowers, veggies, and herbs.

But even members that have front and back yards usually plant some containers to decorate their front stoops and back decks and to fill bare spots in their gardens. But by this time of year, their summer annuals are wilted, and the planters need a refresh.

That's where our October speaker comes in. Back by popular demand, horticulturist Nina Koziol will present "Pots With Panache," showing us how containers can create a dazzling display. This program explores pots, potting mixes, planting techniques, maintenance, and a variety of plants to create four-season interest Nina also will give us some ideas for changing over to winter containers




