## Summarized Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on October 2 & 9, 2023

Due to scheduling conflicts this month, the Board conducted two abbreviated meetings to strategize future Board workflow and time-sensitive business.

#### Monday, October 2 - via Zoom

**Attendees:** Michael Cannon, Adrienne Chan, Scott Legan, Nick Plagman-Frank, and Lynn Ankney

Given our new season of meetings (Board of Directors and general) and a new OIPA Officer lineup (with Michael Cannon assuming the role of President), we discussed roles and responsibilities across the Officer group (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer), including ongoing/official communication with elected officials and establishing and maintaining working relationships with neighboring civic associations. Focusing internally, we talked about making our Board meetings more streamlined by organizing our agendas and updates into executive/committee updates.

More immediately, we discussed logistics for our scheduled general meeting the following Monday, (October 9) and brainstorming possible speakers for the meeting on Monday, November 13.

OIPA Board Involvement with IPR Infrastructure Improvements: As previously reported, Illinois State Senator Martwick and State Representative LaPointe have secured funding (\$700-\$900k) specific to the Irving Park Road/Keeler/Avondale intersection. Quarterly meetings involving Martwick, LaPointe, and Illinois Department of Transportation are beginning this Thursday, October 13 at 10:30 a.m. via Zoom. OIPA Director Dan William will attend these meetings and represent OIPA. (Representative LaPointe was conveniently in the church during our meeting and we pulled her over to confirm Dan's availability and desire to be included).

# Summarized Minutes of the General Meeting on October 9, 2023, 7 p.m.

he meeting started at 7:04 p.m. The October OIPA meeting was the first chaired by newly-elected board president **Michael Cannon**. With standing-room-only, it seems Michael is a big draw—or perhaps it was the various presentations lined up for the night. Regardless, Michael received a warm welcome and first introduced **State Representative Lindsey LaPointe** (District 19).

With our redistricting, Ms. LaPointe communicated that she is the state representative for all of Old Irving Park. With staff and volunteers fluent in English, Spanish, and Polish, LaPointe emphasized her office's role as one focused on constituent services from hyper-local to state levels.

The district office, located at 4349 N. Milwaukee, is open 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday. Constituents are encouraged to call the office at (773) 647-1174 or email Ms. LaPointe at info@replapointe.com with any questions, concerns, or feedback.

Next up on the OIPA October general meeting agenda was a presentation by Schurz High School principal Dr. Heidy Moran and Dee Barrett, Community Outreach Coordinator and fellow OIP neighbor.

Schurz continues to work to build not only community within its walls (e.g., an active student council and student voice committee) but is focused on creating a greater-Schurz family, which includes neighbors and businesses within Old Irving Park's boundaries. School administrators and teachers are encouraging

students to connect with the neighborhood, and the kids themselves are seeking to cultivate relationships outside of Schurz. From community service projects like last year's (and last month's) hugely successful toiletry drive, which delivered much-needed hygiene items to the Irving Park Food Pantry for distribution, to job shadowing, these kids are rolling up their sleeves.

Northwestern Medicine Director of Community Affairs Sarah Burke opened the presentation with Northwestern Medicine's mission: Northwestern Medicine is a premier integrated academic health system where the patients come first.

The packed room was then introduced to Dr. Leonardo Vargas, who will serve as the site's Medical Director. In his opening comments, Dr. Vargas emphasized that this facility, via Vargas, has put a premium on community partnerships. Whether sponsorships, shadowing opportunities, or collaborating with neighborhood entities, Northwestern wants to engage with Old Irving Park residents and businesses fully.

Northwestern Medicine Director of Operations Kara Martin outlined clinical services to be provided onsite, including primary (adolescent and older) and specialty care. A full list of services is available at the above-mentioned website. Other services include an immediate care center (including pediatrics), diagnostics lab, optometrists and optical shop, and a full suite of imaging and rehab services - all integrated with Northwestern Medicine's existing systems. No dental services will be provided.

Major insurance carriers, Medicare and Medicaid, will be accepted as a means of payment.

While the facility is slated to open on November 1, services will ramp up as they recruit physicians. As of

## **OIPA GENERAL** MEETING REPORT

November 1, Northwestern Medicine posted 98 clinical and non-clinical positions with 50 hires (employees, clinicians, physicians); 60% of hires reside in the OIP neighborhood. Open job listings are accessible at https://jobs.nm.org.

For those looking to schedule appointments, call 844-344-6663 or self-schedule via the MyChart portal accessible via Northwestern's website, https://mynm.nm.org/MyChart, or use the MyChart app available for download from the Apple and Google app stores.

Per the speakers, the facility will offer four floors of parking spaces totaling 350 spots for patients, visitors, and employees. Parking will be free with validation. The speakers feel confident the planned number of spots will accommodate staff and patients and not impede street parking. Ms. Martin agreed to communicate to staff that they are to park in the lot and not on the street. However, neighbors remain concerned about traffic patterns as a whole. The traffic light at Irving and Kilbourn will be operational as of November 1, 2023, coinciding with the opening of the building.

With regard to security:

- Security personnel will be onsite 6:30 a.m. 8:30 p.m. on sight. The garage will be closed and secured during off-hours.
- The lot on Kenneth will be fenced in and secured with Arborvitae and prairie grass around its perimeter. There are no plans as of now to develop it.

Following the conclusion of Northwestern Medicine's presentation. OIPA board member

Adrienne Chan announced this year's OIPA "Best Overall" Garden Club winner, Michelle Skoropistsev. Thank you, Michelle, for helping to make OIPA a welcoming and beautiful place to live.





his autumn, the Irving Park Garden Club is encouraging residents to make their fall clean up a bit easier. Do you really need to remove every leaf from your garden? From the pollinator perspective, the answer is "no."

Bee City USA, an initiative of the Xerces Society, reminds us that a neat and tidy garden is just what it looks like — barren and devoid of shelter for bumble bees, mason bees, and so many other pollinators. "Leave the leaves" is a seasonal effort to provide habitat for beneficial insects, pollinators, and other invertebrates.

Protecting these creatures is as easy as doing less yard work in the fall and leaving a layer of leaves an inch or two thick. This protects beneficial insects from predators and insulates them from the elements.

particular, "cavity nesting" bees, like mason bees, utilize these hollow stems.

Providing overwintering habitat is important, since many insect species across North America are experiencing declines, and some are at risk of extinction. Residential areas can provide essential habitat for our invertebrates.

Keeping leaves in your yard doesn't have to be

messy — you can rake leaves into piles and arrange

them around trees or into garden beds. But be sure

not to shred the leaves, as this could kill any insect

eggs or larvae present. Beyond leaving the leaves, many insects use hollow stems as nesting sites, so

keep these stalks until spring to provide habitat. In

## A Warm Welcome to Old Irving Park — Adrienne Chan

Id Irving Park Yoga & Pilates is the studio extension of OIP resident Kathryn Lesher's years of Pilates and yoga training and instruction. Kathryn grew up in Old Irving Park and returned to the neighborhood in 2018 with her husband, Burke, and their two boys. After a career in Occupational Therapy, Kathryn began offering private Pilates instruction from her home on Keeler. As her practice grew, she decided it was time to open a proper studio. When asked why she chose to locate her studio in OIP, she explained, "I have always loved this beautiful neighborhood, but we have always had a lack of walkable neighborhood business. I wanted to create an inviting space conveniently located where people from the neighborhood could come to explore these practices. I think that yoga and Pilates studios can often feel intimidating, and I hope ours feels welcoming. I'm excited to build this business and community in a neighborhood where I've spent so much of my life."

I've had the pleasure of visiting Old Irving Park Yoga & Pilates twice in the past month, first for their opening party and then for my first-ever "Intro to Reformer" Pilates class. Reformer Pilates is a low-impact workout that can help improve overall physical fitness, flexibility, strength, and balance. The new studio at 4316 West Irving Park Road is a quiet and serene oasis despite the traffic outside. The studio has three Reformer Pilates machines, allowing Kathryn to offer small group classes and private sessions.

I attended my first session with two neighbors, both of whom had a little prior experience with the Reformer. The Reformer may look a bit like a medieval torture device, but Kathryn immediately made it less

intimidating by explaining the various components and getting us right to work. The class flew by as we tried out a variety of different moves and machine configurations. Kathryn paired demonstrations with detailed explanations of what muscles should be working and frequently checked in with us regarding what we were feeling to ensure that we were doing each movement properly. Overall, it was a very positive experience.


